



Confidential Reporting Service membership form

This service helps protect participating pig-keepers in three ways:

- By identifying any pig welfare problems before they reach the public domain.
- As a defence against former employees making malicious allegations about poor welfare on a unit.
- As a deterrent to vegan and animal rights activists, by contractually obliging them to report any concerns immediately, rather than in the media at a later date.

Membership is available to all British pig-keepers who are members of the Assured Food Standards Red Tractor Pigs Scheme.

The modest cost of operating the confidential reporting hotline is met from the statutory pig levy. In the event of being notified of any concerns about a pig unit, NPA and BPEX will work with Red Tractor to determine a proportionate response, which may include a spot audit.

The confidential hotline is operated by a specialist company which can provide interpreters if necessary, and where staff are trained to identify and discard vexatious calls (if any).

When you join the Confidential Reporting Service you will be required to display one or more posters which place the following obligation on all visitors and staff:

"Whether you are an employee or a visitor, by entering this site you accept that everything you see is confidential, except that if you observe any aspect of animal welfare that causes you concern you must report it immediately to the unit owner or a senior member of staff or to the confidential reporting service Safecall (where there is no need to give your name)."
